***The Pastoral Corner***

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ –

World Mission Sunday, organized by the Propagation of the Faith, is a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and sacrifice. This year, World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on October 18<sup>th</sup>. Every year the needs of the Catholic Church in the Missions grow - as new dioceses are formed, as new seminaries are opened because of the growing number of young men hearing Christ's call to follow Him as priests, as areas devastated by war or natural disaster are rebuilt, and as other areas, long suppressed, are opening up to hear the message of Christ and His Church. The World Mission Sunday collection helps build up the Church around the world. How do you build up the Church in your daily life?

We are not literally building up our own parish, but as you can see the scaffolding is going up. Eventually the scaffolding will cover both towers in preparation for their repair. The project will last approximately one year. The towers spires and roofs will be repaired with new mortar. The slate roof between the two towers will also be replaced. Both of these repairs will alleviate leakage and damage to the towers and to the interior of the church.

Another repair is also taking place. The Church elevator which is accessed from Columbus Avenue is out of commission until November 1<sup>st</sup>. It is being completely renovated. For access to the Church by elevator, please use the elevator in the Parish Center, which is located at 405 West 59<sup>th</sup> Street. When the Parish Center is closed, there is no elevator access to the Church. This situation shall only happen once: this Monday, October 12<sup>th</sup> as the Parish Center is closed as well as the Church except for one mass at 12:10 PM.

Both of these repairs have long been needed and will improve the Church building's safety and access. Thank you for your patience.

**Did You Know?...Ask Fr. Ron**

In the Catholic Church, the word *Church* is also used to distinguish communities within the Universal Church with distinctive historical and geographical heritages, characterized by their own proper liturgical rites and ecclesiastical organization. In some cases, a particular liturgical *Rite* may correspond exactly to a *Church* in this sense. For example, the Maronite Church has its own Rite not used in any other Church. In other cases, for example, the Byzantine Rite, several Eastern Churches, both Catholic and Orthodox, use the same liturgical Rite.

Broadly speaking, the division between Western and Eastern Catholic Churches and Liturgical Rites reflects the historical division of the Roman Empire into Western and Eastern branches. More precisely, one can categorize the different Churches and Rites in relation to the ancient patriarchates. In 325, the Council of Nicaea recognized three patriarchates - Rome, Alexandria (Egypt), and Antioch (Syria). As capital city of the Eastern Empire, Constantinople acquired patriarchal status in 381, and Jerusalem was belatedly recognized as a patriarchate in 451. The various ecclesiastical structures and liturgical rites reflect this ancient division into patriarchates.

The *Roman Rite* and the other Western Latin Rites related to it all reflect the ecclesiastical and liturgical traditions of the Latin West, centered in Rome. The worldwide expansion of the Church in recent centuries has effectively made most of the Catholic world part of the Latin West, in which the Roman Rite predominates. Within the West, however, certain other Latin Rites have survived and continue in use. One example is the Ambrosian Rite celebrated in Milan. Another is the Mozarabic Rite, the ancient liturgy of the Iberian Peninsula. Largely replaced by the Roman Rite, it remains in use in the Cathedral and six other parishes of Toledo in Spain. The Rite of the Archdiocese of Braga, the Primatial See of Portugal, derives from the Middle Ages and continues to be of occasional use. Historically, certain religious orders – notably the Dominicans, the Carmelites, and the Carthusians have celebrated the liturgy according to their own distinctive, Western, Latin rites.
