

## FROM 59<sup>TH</sup> AND 9<sup>TH</sup>: THE PASTORAL CORNER

Dear Friends -

This Tuesday, January 20<sup>th</sup>, Mr. Barack Obama shall be inaugurated as the 44<sup>th</sup> President of the United States. Whether we are Republican, Democrat or of another political affiliation, we will celebrate the transition of political power and the renewal of our republic in the vision offered by a new president.

The historic occasion of the inaugural is perhaps evidence that we are truly beginning to live the meaning of our equality in our political system and even more, echo Paul's dream for our baptism in Christ Jesus: "*There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female, for all of you are one in Christ*" (Galatians 3:28). We indeed have always been equal in love before the God of love and justice.

As our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration concludes next week with the Feast of the Conversion of Paul, allow me to offer a retrospective.

We began with a Mass on October 28, 2007 celebrated by His Eminence, Theodore Cardinal McCarrick, the retired Archbishop of Newark. Cardinal McCarrick has a long association with the parish and the Paulist Fathers. He celebrated the Mass for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Paulist Fathers and the Parish.

Our parish is so closely tied to the founding of the Paulist Fathers: the parish was founded for the Paulist ministry and the first pastor was the founder of the Paulists, Father Isaac Hecker, CSP. Father Hecker's vision melded the American values of freedom and equality with the freedom bestowed on us by God. How fitting that our celebration continued with the Opening of Hecker's Sainthood Cause on the Conversion of Paul, January 27, 2008. His Eminence, Edward Cardinal Egan formally opened the cause at the conclusion of the mass. Cardinal Egan spoke about the life of Hecker and his importance in the Catholic Church's history in the United States. In a moment of enthusiasm, he also declared that our parish is "*one of the most beautiful churches in the world!*"

On May 14, 2008, the St. Paul Singers under the direction of Anne Holland, Director of Music hosted the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Concert. Our choir again proved how wonderful sung prayer resonates in the acoustics of this amazing church.

The midpoint of our Anniversary coincided with the beginning of the Jubilee Year of Paul, which His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI declared as a time to renew our spiritual relationship with Paul. We celebrated the "*Night Under the Stars*" in the Church. We opened the Year of Paul with chanted vespers on the eve of the Feast of Peter and Paul. On the Feast Day, Archbishop Celestino Migliore of the Holy See's Mission to the United Nations led us in the opening mass of the Year of Paul. Throughout the Year, we have been sponsoring special lectures and programs on Paul, which have been well attended.

We will continue offering readings of the letters in their entirety through the remaining part of the Year of Paul, which c

concludes on the Feast of Peter and Paul, June 29, 2009.

These anniversaries and commemorations of Paul are signs of hope. They remind us that we are blessed with a community of believers who have gone before us and who remain united with us in spirit and in prayer. We are never alone or without the love of God. As our nation celebrates the inauguration of its 44<sup>th</sup> President of the United States, we are hopeful that we will not be discouraged about the enormous challenges of our world.

May God bless the Paulist Fathers, our parish, and the people of the United States of America and our world with peace and great hope.

*Celebrating the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul*

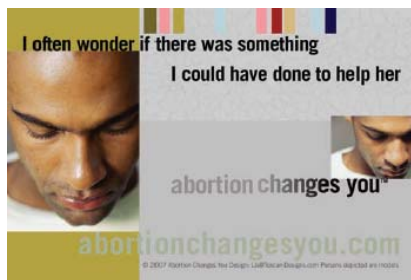
