The Pastor's Column



The Town Hall is Open!

As the church is in Synod in Rome listening and discerning where the Holy Spirit is leading us as a universal church, here at St. Paul's we've launched our own discernment on a local level. This past Saturday, we held the first of many town hall meetings to listen to the diverse voices of our parish. For the first meeting, we invited parishioners from across the spectrum: representatives from different parish groups, those who have served in parish leadership over the years, others who have more recently arrived, and so forth. It was a great gathering of the faithful who truly have a heart for St. Paul's and want to see our parish grow and thrive.

The consistent theme that emerged is the desire to be a more interconnected parish. How can our various groups work together to advance the mission to care for our parishioners and our neighbors? Recognizing that Covid had fragmented the community, the group was anxious for ways in which we can unite and plan opportunities for people to connect and for groups to collaborate. Participants also shared what they loved about the parish. Here again, there was a consistent theme of community and welcome. We value the bonds of community as well as the diversity of St. Paul's. The music program as well as our worship were also particular points of pride. Of course, there are areas that need attention. We need to restart the Seniors Group; reach out to young couples and families; be attentive to the needs of our youth. I know this is just the beginning of a larger list. Overall, hopefulness dominated the gathering giving us much to build on.

News of the horrific violence in Israel and Palestine has left us with aching hearts. Pope Francis expressed his grief during this past Sunday's Angelus address:


"I express my closeness to the families and victims. I am praying for them and for all who are living hours of terror and anguish. May the attacks and weaponry cease. Please! And let it be understood that terrorism and war do not lead to any resolutions, but only to the death and suffering of so many innocent people. War is a defeat! Every war is a defeat! Let us pray that there be peace in Israel and in Palestine."

We join with the Holy Father in praying for peace and unity, and echo the prayers of Iraqi Cardinal Louis Raphaël Sako who shared this prayer with attendees at the Vatican's Synod on Synodality currently meeting in Rome:

"Oh God, who cares for all, let the whole of humanity who have one origin from you, form one family, without violence, without wars and with brotherly spirit, live united in peace and concord for our Lord Jesus Christ Your Son who is God, lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit for ever and ever."

The Holy Father has also implored the faithful to pray the rosary in October so that Mary's intercession and protection may bring the peace of Christ to our troubled world.




A New Mass Setting Premiers at St. Paul's

Sigrid Undset is among the great modern writers of the twentieth century and was an adult convert to Catholicism. This forgotten treasure from the Nobel Prize—winning author of *Kristin Lavransdatter* is a fascinating collection of saints' lives and a surprisingly contemporary take on being Catholic — in particular a Catholic woman — in a sometimes-hostile secular world.

Stages on the Road is a series of essays about the relationship between the Church and the modern world. In the spirit of G. K. Chesterton and C. S. Lewis, Undset points to inconsistencies, hypocrisies, and blind spots of the modern secular mindset by introducing readers to the stories of somewhatforgotten Catholic figures like St. Angela Merici and the English martyrs Margaret Clitherow and Robert Southwell — people who stood fast to their faith in the face of both intellectual and political hostility.
