Some Advent Thoughts.

Welcome to the shortest Advent Season possible! With Christmas falling on a Monday this year, there isn't a fourth week of Advent, just one day. This means our time to prepare ourselves spiritually for Christmas is shortened.

To truly experience the joy of Christmas, we need a good Advent. Here's some friendly advice on how you might do that. Consider spending some time discerning the presence of Jesus, our Savior, in your life. In what way does the world need a Savior right now; how do I need a savior to intervene in my life? Jesus asks us to be prepared, watchful, and ready for his second coming. How's that going for me? How have I followed Christ's two great commandments: Loving God fully and completely and loving your neighbor as yourself? This is the litmus test on what ready and watchful look like. Advent is all about looking to the future with hope. Is this your outlook? If not, what might change that?

If reflection questions aren't your bag, perhaps silent meditation is. It is a very good way to pray and get away from the noise and demands that come this time of year. Create a quiet meditative space at home or come to Church for a quiet visit. Try to still yourself as best you can, repeating the Advent mantra "Come Lord Jesus" to keep you focused. If the quiet moment leads to a nap, so be it! You might need one. If the quiet conjures up uncomfortable thoughts or feelings, seek out a trusted friend to discuss it. If you get an amazing insight, write it down and savor it! Finally, prayer and reflection must lead to action. What is the Holy Spirit calling you to do? As you pray to love your neighbors as yourself, how can you give the gift of yourself to someone in need of your time and attention?

My hope is that we all find some time to get away from the hustle and bustle of December and care for our souls. It's the one gift we can give to God, ourselves, and others all at the same time!

Next week I'll answer the million-dollar question: Do I have to go to Mass two times Christmas Weekend?




Giving Tree 2023




St. Paul's Advent Calendar


The church was packed last Saturday night for Fordham University's annual Lessons and Carols!

A special thanks to parishioners and volunteers from across our ministries that gave their time to help us set up for our Christmas Time in the City concert!




A Year to Treasure 2024 Calendar

The St. Paul's Choir Christmas Eve Prelude Saturday, December 24th at 11PM Free Admission






St. Paul's Book Club
