The Pastor's Column

St. Paul the Apostle, Pray for Us!

During the first week of March, the Paulist Fathers General Council will be meeting in special session to discern in a particular way where the Holy Spirit is calling our Society of Apostolic Life at this present moment. Like many religious communities and (Arch)Dioceses across the country, the reality of the shortage of priests is upon us. In the Archdiocese of New York, parishes are combining as there aren't enough pastors for all the congregations. If you hadn't heard, Sacred Heart Parish on West 51st Street and St. Malachy's the Actor's Chapel have been combined and are now served by one pastor. The same is true for Holy Name Parish and St. Gregory's on the Upper West Side in the 90s, and Corpus Christi and Notre Dame parishes near Columbia University.

For the Paulist Fathers, some recent unforeseen personnel challenges have left two or three of our foundations shorthanded with many senior Paulists from our Motherhouse and elsewhere helping for extended periods. We barely have enough Paulists for all our ministerial commitments and demographic studies suggest that we will hit a real crunch by 2034. At the March meeting, the Paulist General Council will most likely decide to withdraw from at least two of our worshipping communities.

Each parish, campus ministry, and downtown center has been asked to evaluate their ministries with an eye to sustainability as well as Paulist mission. Each location has been asked to submit data on collections, attendance, programs, etc. Paulist Fathers President Fr. René Constanza has shared that final decisions haven't been made yet and all our commitments are on the table for review. That said, as a realist, it is clear to me we won't be leaving St. Paul's here in New York as it is the Mother Church of the community.

While I was President of the Paulists, we withdrew from four of our ministries over my eight-year term. We decided to withdraw from three; a local bishop asked us to leave the fourth. Each leave taking was a dying experience for those who valued our presence. It took the stuffing out of all involved: parishioners, staff, and Paulists. Many Paulists still lament those places they served in the past that we have left. Parishioners of those places have fond remembrances of our ministry, some are mad at us for leaving, others stay connected through the Paulist Associates program and our own Virtch Church outreach.

This is all ugly business, frankly, and no matter what happens, many people will be hurt, angry, and upset. So, I ask you to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance of the Paulist General Council that they make wise decisions and implement them with a compassionate heart. Pray for vocations to the Paulist priesthood and religious life while also asking the Spirit to guide our discernment as Church on who may be called to serve as a Deacon or Priest. Finally commend to the Sacred Heart of Jesus those parishioners and Paulists who will have to bring to a close a treasured time of ministry by the Paulist Fathers. That's where the impact will be felt most of all.

May God be with us all, leading us from death to new life in the Spirit which is the journey of Lent to Easter.







Journey - Encounter - Reflect


This Lent, journey with us to encounter the mercy of God, reflect on our blessings, and help each other carry our burdens.

Part of the journey of Lent involves living as Jesus did during the forty days in the desert. Every year, we like to remind parishioners of the designated days of fasting and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics aged 18-59. Fasting is defined as taking one full meal during the day, and two smaller meals to maintain physical strength. Those small meals should not equal a full meal in quantity. Abstinence forbids the eating of meat and poultry; this is compulsory on Fridays in Lent.



St. Paul's often hosts groups of young musicians who are on tour around the country and offer free concerts to the public in our church. Join them for a wonderful break in any day!


